CHaRM

- Center for Hard to Recycle Materials and working with Agnes Scott to develop an abandoned lot to create a new center for collection as well as a community garden and farm
 - Managed my sustainability non-profit called Live THrive
 - Permanent Drop-off facility that encourages reuse by diverting and recycling thousands of pounds of hard to recycle waste (tires, mattress, paint
 - Currently a Facility in Southeast Atlanta

- After the first facility the neighborhood saw a dramatic drop in illegal dumpings and beautification improvement
- Turning 5 acres in the big lot behind Kroger (was supposed to be soccer fields but they ended up using an old field so the lad was up for grabs) Currently, the MOU is being finalized with Commissioner Johnson's Office
- Project benefits
 - o Agricultural benefit, community gardening, educational farm
- We will have the opportunity as a community to provide actionable input on this project

Q&A:

- Private security patrol: is the private security patrol with a separate fund that pays on off duty officer who works with the Dekalb police south precinct and the enforcement team and patrols 10 hours a week and helps monitor our hotspots like the park, Memorial Drive, Joyce and Line, and a few other hot spots in his california blues and his flights. Also has vacation monitoring via a form online that you can fill out so they will go by and check out your home while you are gone. Lots of benefits to this and allows the neighborhood enforcement team to come to the neighborhood and patrol here often since he is associated. He is also able to respond to calls when he is in the area which allows for fast response time and proactive efforts. Monitors ND and answers our questions to the best of his ability. Very dedicated to BP and making our neighborhood safer. He does utilize a community policing effort so he knows when to use certain measures
- Agriculture based non-profit (nothing is confirmed) But they will be something similar to the "vibe" of the Wylde center and then ¾ of the use being used for plots for neighbors use
- Do we have a timeline? Not really, hoping for sooner rather than later, Agnes Scott and CHaRM are highly
 motivated and are working very hard to push it though
- Public Safety concerns and connecting with DeKalb Crisis centers to assists women at eh Cit"no"
